Reports to:	Director of Community Programs
Function:	Develop and grow relationships with local and regional partners to implement relevant Trees Forever programming in your territory. This position coordinates projects, provides assistance to communities and volunteer groups, recruits communities for Trees Forever programs and delivers environmental education presentations throughout the year. Field coordinators participate in major Trees Forever events and operate as part of a larger team of field coordinators across Iowa and Illinois.

Primary Responsibilities

Program Delivery

- Engage, motivate, and coordinate volunteers, community groups, city staff, and private landowners on the following:
 - How to organize, develop, and grow local volunteer groups
 - Planting and educational events, as well as leading and participating in these events
- Provide technical assistance to volunteer, communities, local organizations, volunteer groups and landowners on the following:
 - Species selection and care
 - Care and maintenance of planting projects
 - Recommendations and/or review of site designs and plans
 - Educating the public and youth regarding trees & best practices
 - Implementing community forestry needs specific to each community and implementing those needs in short-term and/or long-term.
 - Advising on Tree City USA requirements including developing city ordinances and tree care standards
 - Assist communities with Trees Forever grant reporting requirements
- Facilitate diverse groups of individuals, community groups, etc. in planning for their community needs
- Lead special projects by tracking task and deliverables, coaching fellow staff on how to meet the objectives, etc.
- Fulfill requests for Trees Forever speaking, presentation, and display engagements and assist in coordinating special events
- Promote and position Trees Forever in keeping with its mission and brand
- Assist with grant proposals and follow-up reporting
- Identify new initiatives that will grow the work of Trees Forever and community forestry. Take the initiative to lead these efforts and foster a continuous improvement ethic
- Work as a member of the Trees Forever Program Team and other staff teams as needed
- Become familiar with Trees Forever history, branding, organization, and programs.
- Participate in program evaluation, which includes ongoing assessment and improvement of Trees Forever programs

- Take an active role in reporting including tracking and completion of weekly, monthly, and quarterly reporting
- Completing related work as required

Required Skills/Abilities:

- A proven passion for service, the environment, and sustainability
- Strong communication skills including proficiency in writing reports, prompt correspondence and completing other administrative tasks
- Ability to work effectively with Trees Forever stakeholders from diverse backgrounds and at varying levels of expertise
- Enthusiasm for learning more about community planning, Midwest native ecosystems, urban forestry, or to become an ISA Certified Arborist
- Strong leadership traits, such as ability to give/receive constructive feedback, critical thinking skills, and confidence in taking initiative
- Background in group and process facilitation
- Effective public presentation abilities
- Adaptable to a dynamic work environment
- Experience and interest in working with volunteers, groups and committee
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office software
- Technological skills and personal discipline necessary to set up and operate from a home office (with financial support from Trees Forever)

Qualifications/Position Requirements

- Bachelor's degree preferred, but not required
- Knowledge of Midwest plant communities is a plus
- Remote - home office to be located in a location that will serve the southeast portion of the state.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office software
- Ability to attend educational courses, workshops, seminars or conferences on topics relating to and benefiting program delivery and development
- Position requires reliable transportation and willingness to travel, including overnight trips and evening and weekend meetings
- Ability to work a flexible work schedule. Some weekend and evening hours will be required.
- Valid U.S. Driver's License required plus reliable transportation and willingness to travel, including occasional overnight trips, and some evening and weekend meetings
- Must be able to pass a background check
- Must have a clean driving record
