



Duties and Responsibilities

Works with and under the supervision of MPF Director of Prairie Management to carry out the following work:

- —Identification, tracking, and treatment of non-native, invasive herbaceous plants with targeted, careful use of specific herbicides
- —Identification, tracking, and treatment of invasive woody growth, with herbicide and mechanical means
- —Prescribed burning, including fire line preparation
- Occasionally, perform flora and fauna surveys and inventories
- —Install, maintain, and repair area signage and infrastructure as needed
- —Maintain work log including mileage documentation, hours worked, herbicide mixed/used, and acreage covered
- —Utilize a purchasing card and maintain accurate records of purchasing and receipts





Salary range \$35,000-\$45,000/year based on experience and education. MPF will provide work truck, computer, cell phone, PPE/field apparel, and other items necessary to perform work.

Benefits:

\$3,000 a year health care stipend (cash); maximum two weeks pay for jury duty; 10 paid holidays; 5 hours paid vacation accrued every two-week pay period (vacation hours increase with seniority); 64 hours of sick/personal time per year available 30 days after date of employment; and, after one year, eligibility to participate in MPF's SIMPLE IRA with an MPF 3% match. Opportunity to attend a continuing education conference or training at least once annually.


Minimum Qualifications

Bachelor's degree in natural resources, wildlife management, ecology, biology, botany, or related field or high school diploma with at least two years experience in invasive plant control, prescribed burning, or natural resources management.

Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

The following set of skills, knowledge, and abilities are





- —Operation of a motor vehicle
- —Work out-of-doors in extreme hot or cold temperatures
- —Ability to lift and carry backpack sprayers, and occasionally lift and carry bags of seed and other equipment of at least 40 pounds
- —Walk in rough terrain and participate on the ground with prescribed burns
- —Express oneself clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing
- —Work an occasional evening or weekend
- —Starting work early and/or ending late in the day may be required, with ability to flex hours
- —Travel and stay overnight occasionally
- —Carry out other related tasks as assigned

Preferred but not required:


- -Knowledge of prairie ecosystems, particularly prairie biota




Missouri Prairie Foundation Vision:
